Every week, WE START CLASS REVIEWING THE CARPET RULES SONG IN SPANISH AND THE VOCABU-LARY WE LEARNED IN THE PREVIOUS WEEKS. STUDENTS ANSWER QUESTIONS ABOUT THE MEANING OF THE WORDS ON THE POSTER AND THE VOCABULARY REVIEW. IN THE FOLLOWING WEEKS, THE STUDENTS WILL BE LEARNING GREETINGS, HOW TO ASK AND TELL THEIR AGE IN SPANISH, MORE COLORS, BODY PARTS (HEAD, SHOULDERS, KNEES, AND TOES), NUMBERS 1-31, THE DAYS OF THE WEEK, THE MONTHS OF THE YEAR, AND HOW TO WRITE AND TELL THE DATE IN Spanish.
