## Austin 3–1–1 and Other Useful Resources

The <u>Austin 3–1–1 smartphone app</u> allows users to report potholes, graffiti, loose dogs, and much more with just a few clicks. If apps aren't your thing, dial 3–1–1 to talk to a friendly and knowledgeable City of Austin ambassador. 3–1–1 ambassadors are always ready to assist with any issue you may have regarding City of Austin departments or services, answer questions, or take reports. Dial 3–1–1 or 512–974–2000.

- AustinPD: find station locations, crime prevention information and news updates. Users also can send anonymous tips and file certain reports via the app.
- <u>Austin Energy Outage Map</u>: To view or report power outages in your areas, go to <u>the online AE outage map</u>. You also can register to report outages and get phone alerts by texting REG to 287846.
